

For Helping to Leave, 2024 was a year of qualitative changes. The demand for help from Ukrainians affected by russia's criminal military aggression is enormous, and unfortunately, it is only growing by the day.

We, the Helping to Leave Team, are those who can and want to help. We understand that assistance must be systematic, reliable, and long-lasting. Therefore, in 2024, we developed and approved the project's 3-year Strategy. We have determined who, how, and in what way we will help, where we will look for funding, and how and with whom we will develop and grow.

And yes, even if the turbulent start of 2025 makes its own adjustments, we are not the kind of people who retreat. We are helping and will continue to help. Because we are Helping to Leave.

Thank you very much for giving us the opportunity to evacuate my mother. Now we are relieved that she is safe. We wish you strength and patience in your valuable work and God's protection.


Happy New Year! Thank You so much for the miracle You gifted us. From the whole family, we thank You and your entire team. You are really cool!!!!!!!






The year 2024 was a difficult one. In May, an offensive on the Kharkiv Oblast began, which resulted in several settlements of the Vovchansk and Lipetsk communities being occupied. The number of applications for evacuation increased significantly, and almost all charitable foundations in the Kharkiv Oblast took part in the evacuation from unsafe areas.

Access to the settlements was only possible for a few days after the start of the offensive, and then evacuations took place only from the outskirts. Some people had to walk to such places where they were picked up by volunteers or the national police. There were cases when people were forcibly taken to russia by the occupation forces, and we did our best to bring them back to Ukraine through the humanitarian corridors. We still receive requests from families who are looking for and cannot find their relatives.

August was also memorable — the Sumy humanitarian corridor, through which the main traffic of evacuees from the temporarily occupied territories passed, was shut down. From that moment on, there was only one humanitarian corridor left — in the Volyn Oblast.

This complicated our work and made it harder for displaced people to return to the Ukrainian-controlled areas. The route has become longer, more difficult, and more expensive: one had to cross not only the russian borders but also belorussian, which required additional documents. We managed to reorganize our work within just a few days, before we were already welcoming hundreds of people in Domanovo after they crossed the border and helped them continue their journey across the free Ukrainian land.


Despite everything, there have been some positive moments. We've made important steps towards helping people with reintegration in their new homes after the evacuation. We now have an adaptation program whose curator helps displaced people with applying for social benefits, solving problems with documents, and most importantly, finding long-term housing, especially for the most vulnerable groups. We do not just evacuate people but give them the opportunity to start a new life in safety.





We started 2024 with 481 recurring donors and ended it with 316. How many days a year have you heard that people are tired of the war? Yes, every day, we felt it by the number of unsubscribes. But when in early 2025 we, like many foundations, found ourselves without grant support, we realized that the only things that could help us were the 316 people with whom we would make it through the most difficult times.

Seeing the number of people who can support the project decrease every day is one of the hardest things I've ever seen in my life. Hard because I know that no one is to blame, that opportunities are different. And it is painful for people to admit that they can no longer support our work. We have received many letters of support together with requests for subscription cancellations. And we are very grateful for the road that has been traveled with us.

We refuse to believe that fatigue can kill faith; it is forbidden to us by our profession. We did not give up and found more than 100 new likeminded people. Yes, there are fewer of us, but everyone who continues to support us is a ray of light to the belief that we can do it. We update the platforms several times a day and see your contributions. You should see my face when I discover a new follower. I think the glow of my eyes would be enough to light up a midsized European city.

I would like to say a special "thank you" for 2024 to those who announced personal fundraisers among friends — you helped us cover the emergency expenses for the most difficult evacuations. And thank you to those who responded with one-time donations in addition to their recurring one.

Thank you all. No matter what, it is thanks to your care in 2024 that we will not stop in 2025.


